Objective	The objective of the systems analysis course is to deepen and illustrate the mathematical concepts on the basis of a series of very concrete examples. Topics covered include: linear box models with one or several variables, non-linear box models with one or several variables, time-discrete models, and continuous models in time and space.
Content	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Introduction to mathematical modelling and optimization. Building and classification of mathematical models. Database of energy and nutritional composition of food products. Basics of linear optimization. Numerical methods of optimization. Linear regression, method of smallest squares, trapezoidal method, syrup method. Pareto optimization. Analysis and simulation of processes. Overview of software for optimization, programming and analysis. Economic optimization.
